## Eucharistic Adoration

1st Tuesdays—OLH (beginning March 2)

1st Wednesdays—OLPH

Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration is the adoration of Jesus Christ present in the Holy Eucharist. You can come to worship and to visit with Jesus. You can tell him your problems, your needs and concerns, your joys. Many find peacefulness during their time spent with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.



Eucharistic adoration consists of:

- Exposition
- Adoration (worship and prayer)
- Benediction
- Reposition

**Exposition.** The ceremony in which a priest (or deacon) removes the Sacred Host from the tabernacle and places it in the monstrance for adoration.

**Benediction.** A Eucharistic devotion in which those gathered are blessed with the Blessed Sacrament.

**Reposition.** The placing of the Blessed Sacrament back into the tabernacle

### Guidelines for Eucharistic Adoration

- Maintain an absolute quiet when entering and leaving the church / chapel during adoration.
- Genuflect one knee (or bow if unable to genuflect) when entering and then when leaving.
- Spend the time of adoration praying, contemplating, worshipping, or doing spiritual reading.
- Kneel during Exposition (when the tabernacle is opened) and Benediction (when the priest kneels).

## Ash Wednesday Masses & Distribution of Blessed Ashes

The Archdiocese of Louisville has given instructions for the distribution of ashes on Ash Wednesday, issued by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, there will be some changes to the distribution of ashes this year amid the coronavirus pandemic.

- At the appropriate time, the Priest will bless the ashes, then aloud he addresses all those present, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." This is said only once and not individually to each person.
- Ashes will then be distributed to the faithful in the form of sprinkling on the top of the head. This method avoids direct skin contact between persons. While most Americans are more familiar with the placing of ashes on the forehead in the shape of a cross, the sprinkling of ashes is very common in Catholic cultures around the world.
- Ministers and the faithful should wear masks and social distance while in line the same as when receiving Communion.

## Lenten Fasting & Abstinence

The forty days of fasting before Easter includes every day of Lent except Sundays, beginning on Ash Wednesday and ending on Holy Saturday, inclusive. Thus, there are forty-six days of Lent (including Good Friday and Holy Saturday), but only forty fast days since Sundays are excluded.

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are universal days of both fasting and abstinence from eating meat.

Abstinence is also observed on all Fridays of Lent. Catholics age 14 and older are bound to observe abstinence regulations except for serious reasons; Catholics age 18-59 are bound to observe fasting regulations except for serious reasons. For all other weekdays of Lent, the Church encourages fasting, either in the traditional sense or through some other form of self-denial determined by conscience.

## First Sunday of Lent (February 21)

"...he also went to preach to the spirits in prison, who had once been disobedient while God patiently waited..." 1 Peter 3:19-20

Regardless of whether one has been a good steward of gifts in the past, it is never too late to begin sharing with a generous heart. Decide how you will use your blessings of time, talent, and treasure in service to God, the source of all blessings. Begin small if necessary, but begin!

We come together for prayer and reflection during Lent to follow the Passion of Jesus Christ on his way to Calvary with the Stations of the Cross. Our Stations will take place: Begins after Ash Wednesday.
