## Maranatha Retreat for the Chronically Ill and Caregivers

Jesus suffered for us. It's the message driven home all through Holy Week as we read the "The Passion of Jesus Christ." However, we may not always be aware that, *when we suffer*, Jesus suffers along with us. Illness can be an occasion to get closer to God, to enter more deeply into the mystery of His love. Of course, that's easy to say, but infinitely more difficult to live through...for the sufferer as well as their loved ones. But it is possible - because God makes it possible.

St. Ignatius of Loyola, a Spanish knight over 500 years ago, dreamed of living a glorious life. But he was seriously wounded in battle. During his long and difficult recovery, he began to notice for the first time that he had a spiritual life. *He noticed that Jesus wanted to walk with him and love him as a friend.* St. Ignatius asked the question: "How can I be free to walk with Jesus and experience His friendship, even when I suffer?"

That is the question explored by the Maranatha Retreat Ministry in Louisville. *Maranatha Retreat offers a one-day retreat for the chronically ill as well as their caregivers.*

*Finding God in all things, even in our suffering, is what Maranatha Retreats are about. The retreat offers the gift of sharing, meditation, and prayer through retreat activities to those who might not otherwise have the opportunity.* We utilize Ignatian Spirituality; that is, the Christian spirituality taught by St. Ignatius of Loyola and the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) through the centuries.

If you, a family member, or a friend have a chronic illness (or are a caregiver), this retreat is designed specifically for you. The retreat will give you the time and space to develop your relationship with God. There will be time in large groups, time in small groups, time for quiet, time for prayer, and time for conversation. The retreat is led by a highly qualified team of facilitators from across the Archdiocese.

If you have a chronic illness or are a caregiver, and are interested in attending a Maranatha Retreat, we encourage you to see the information below:

*The next Maranatha Retreat will be held May 14 at the Flaget Center, 1935 Lewiston Drive, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. The retreat is free, but registration is required. It will be offered to 10 individuals living with any chronic illness and 10 individuals who serve as caregivers.*
