A Reflection from Deacon Jimmy - Sept. 2022

If anyone had ever asked me, before 2014, if I had a desire to ever become ordained as a Permanent Deacon in the Catholic Church, I would have laughed and politely said “No.” I remember having lots of other plans that had not involved discerning God’s Will for me. But in 2014, shortly after Therese and I had lost both our sons and Therese’s mother, a friend of mine in Frankfort planted the seed of “vocational calling,” which took deep root in my heart. I just couldn’t shake it. With that memory in mind, I pray that all men who read this reflection, especially those between the ages of 35 and 60, prayerfully discern a call to serve God as a Deacon. I can guarantee you that your life will change for the better, and you will find true joy by the service you provide. I encourage you to talk with your wife first and then me, about the opportunity you and your family have to grow closer to God by accepting His call.

I still find people who don’t understand what a Deacon is or the difference between what Deacon’s and Priests do. I still occasionally have parishioners call me Father. First, most deacons are volunteers, unpaid and not employees of the Diocese. There are a few exceptions, those who accept administrative jobs in the Church. I am not a paid employee of the Church. Second, as most of you know, deacons can be married with families to support, and with family obligations. Many still have full time outside employment besides being a volunteer deacon. Deacons are also told to honor their marriage and family vows first, since they were married before ordination. Those who feel called to discern the Diaconate must have their wife’s approval. She must agree that she will attend the monthly trainings. Spiritual training improves you. It is only fitting that both spouses grow closer to God together; (Year one - monthly on one Saturday 9-5; and years 2-5 monthly on one Friday night, Saturday, and Sunday morning) Lunch, dinner, snacks, lodging and books are all free for the aspiring deacon as and his spouse. Deacons report to the Archbishop and are assigned to parishes within approximately 30 miles of their home. While all deacons serve in liturgical roles, their ministries may look very different depending on personal interests and acceptance of requested service. Deacons are allowed to say no to ministries they are not interested in. For example, deacons are allowed to:

- Proclaim the Gospel
- Deliver homilies
- Serve Priests at Mass
- Serve as Ordinary Ministers of the Eucharist
- Preside at the Sacraments of Baptism and Matrimony
- Preside at Funeral Vigils, Funerals outside of Mass and Burials
- Minister to people in a variety of settings such as the homeless, hospitals, nursing homes, prisons and jails
- Do charitable work such as helping in shelters, soup kitchens, community projects, crisis relief
- Live a life and presence firmly planted both inside and outside the parish
- Serve alongside volunteer laity and within their communities.

I pray that this brief overview may have sparked an interest in serving God and your neighbor. Anyone interested in finding out more can call, email or ask me the next time you see me. My email is jdmtricherson@yahoo.com and phone is 502-229-9839. Starting this Fall the Archdiocese will offer information meetings and discernment evenings to prepare for the next class. It will start 2023 and graduate in 2028. You will meet people just like you, the nicest people in the world. I hope to still be in good health when they graduate. Realistically I will be 74 years old and required to submit a retirement letter to the archbishop at 75.

The time to step up is now. God may be calling You!!!
